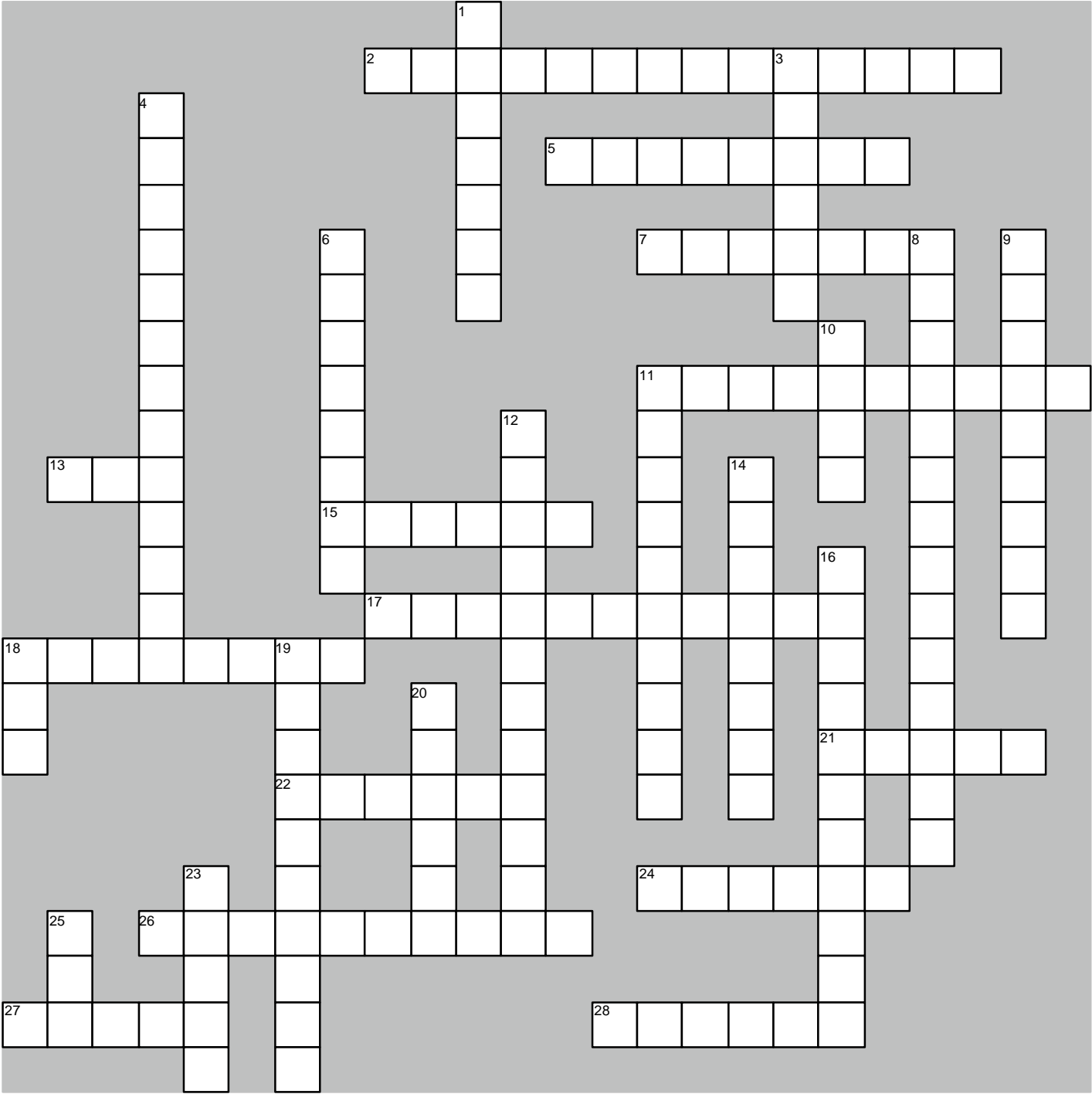

- 18 the President who led the nation out of the Great Depression (initials)
- 19 when times are bad; unemployment is high; wages, prices, and profits are low; little business activity
- 20 the President when the Great Depression began; he mistakenly believed it would be short and end by itself
- 23 The Stock Market "\_\_\_\_\_" of October 1929 signaled the end of the Roaring Twenties and the beginning of the Great Depression.
- 25 a work-relief program that undertook public building projects, included projects for jobless writers, artists, musicians, and actors, and provided part-time jobs for students (initials)
