a period of very high unemployment and little business activity

the name given to FDR's plans to end the Great Depression

the 1st goal of the New Deal...immediate help for those most hurt by the depression

the 2nd goal of the New Deal...get business moving and get people back to work

guarantees that money
people put in a bank
is safe

“public works” program
that tried to put all
unemployed persons
back to work

New Deal program that
started and ongoing effort
to take care of the elderly,
the disabled, and others
who are unable to take care
of themselves

New Deal agency that
continues to monitor and
regulate the stock market

the 3rd goal of the New Deal...make changes to prevent another serious depression in the future

the event that brought about the final end of the Great Depression

the lowest amount that an employer can pay an employee

put young people from poor families to work while helping to restore and preserve natural resources
