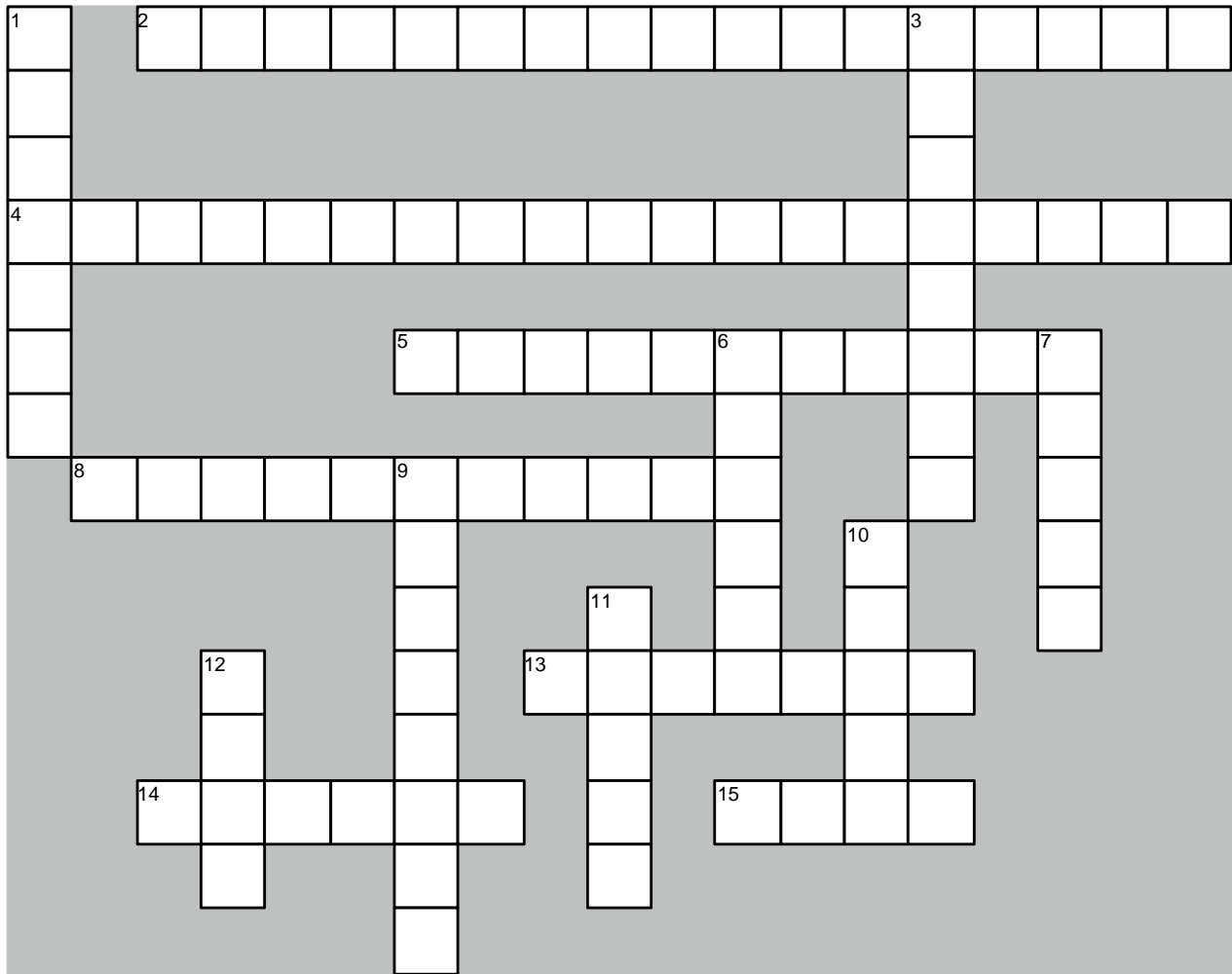


### The Civil Rights Movement
